

you get got.



This is a great clinic to sharpen and advance your horsemanship skills. We teach maneuvers that are common to dressage, but are also used in cow working, ranch roping, and other types of riding. These maneuvers include working your horse with collection for longer periods of time, leg yield or two-track, haunches in, shoulder in, half-halt, counter-canter, canter depart, simple and flying lead changes, and other moves.

This clinic is open to all disciplines and all levels of rider, but novices would do best to participate in at least one of our Horsemanship clinics before signing up for this clinic.

Clinic is \$290 for the weekend, auditors are \$25 per day, stalls available at \$15 a day


