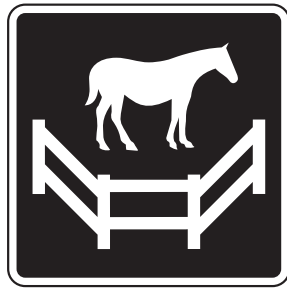

TONASKET RANGER DISTRICT

Fourteen Mile Campground & Trailhead has an outhouse, loading ramp, hitch rails, and stock water in creek. Albert Camp Trail starts at Fourteen Mile Trailhead. Recreation pass required.
CAPACITY: 2 horses per campsite or 12 horses at the trailhead
NUMBER OF CAMPSITES: 2 at the parking area, 6-7 at Fourteen Mile Campground.

Iron Gate Trailhead has a loading ramp, hitch rails, and an outhouse. No water is available. The Boundary Trail takes off from this trailhead and intersects with a number of other trails along the way. This is a popular trailhead for both hikers and horseback riders looking for the quickest access into Horseshoe Basin. The trailhead is best suited to those starting out early in the day and planning to go some distance before setting up camp. A recreation pass is required.
NUMBER OF CAMPSITES: None

Long Swamp Campground & Trailhead has a loading ramp, hitch rails, an outhouse, and stock water in the creek. This trailhead is well suited to those looking for day rides as well as those looking for a starting point to head into the Pasayten Wilderness. Windy Peak Trail starts at the Long Swamp Trailhead. A recreation pass is required.
CAPACITY: 2 horses per campsite or 12 horses at the trailhead
NUMBER OF CAMPSITES: 2 in Long Swamp Campground

Chewuch Trailhead has an outhouse, a loading ramp, hitch rails, stock water in the creek, and limited parking. Cathedral Driveway Trail leaves from this trailhead and intersects with both Basin Creek and Windy Creek Trails. A recreation pass is required.
CAPACITY: 12 horses at the trailhead
NUMBER OF CAMPSITES: 1

Salmon Meadows Campground has some unique historic features built by the Civilian Conservation Corps. Situated just past the end of a paved road, the campground has rock chimneys for the fire pits and a large covered gazebo/kitchen. It has horse corrals and there are some terrific day rides nearby making it a popular place for weekend campouts. There is stock water at the creek.
CAPACITY: Horses are not allowed in the campground, only in the adjacent meadow.
NUMBER OF CAMPSITES: 7 campsites, \$5 per vehicle per night fee.

North Fork Salmon Trailhead has an outhouse, loading ramps, and hitch rails. No water is available nor are there established camping sites. Clark Ridge Trail leaves this trailhead. This route also offers access to the North Summit and Tiffany Lake Trails.
CAPACITY: 12 horses at the trailhead
NUMBER OF CAMPSITES: None.

Fourth of July Ridge Trailhead has an outhouse, loading ramp, and hitch rails. There is no water, nor places to camp. From the Fourth of July Ridge Trailhead riders can take the 4th of July Ridge Trail to the Southside Trail which offers access to either Bonaparte Lake or Bonaparte Lookout.
CAPACITY: 12 horses at the trailhead
NUMBER OF CAMPSITES: None.

Horse Camps and Facilities in the Okanogan-Wenatchee National Forest

Horse use is a popular pastime in both the Okanogan and Wenatchee Forests and there are many locations and facilities available for horse users. This brochure contains information on most of those facilities. We hope you find it helpful.

Be prepared for rough access roads to many of these facilities. Many of the trails accessed from the horse facilities listed in this brochure enter Wilderness areas. Be sure to check with the local ranger stations to learn of the special requirements or restrictions, including weed-free feed requirements, for the area you plan to visit. Many noxious weeds are introduced onto the forest. Using bailed hay, straw, or unprocessed grain feed is prohibited in the wilderness. Certified, weed-free hay may contain viable plant seeds, not considered weeds, but exotic. The intent here is to prevent the introduction of any non-native plants in the wilderness. Take processed pelleted feed, as grazing is limited. All campsites are available on a first-come, first-serve basis.

CHELAN RANGER DISTRICT

South Navarre Campground (located approximately 17 miles north of Antilon Lake on Road #8200) is the only developed horse camp on the Chelan Ranger District. This campground has a loading ramp, one hitch rail, four tables, four fire rings, and three toilets. No purified drinking water or forage is available.

CAPACITY: 4-6 horses total

NUMBER OF CAMPSITES: 4. No camping fee required. This is a semi-developed campground, check with the ranger station to see if the water is turned on.

CLE ELUM RANGER DISTRICT

There are numerous dispersed sites in the Teanaway, Fish Lake Valley, and Taneum/Manastash areas with nearby stock trails (or cross-country riding), streams for stock watering, and a variety of human amenities/facilities. Call the Cle Elum District office for up-to-date information regarding stock use.

Cayuse Campground – Located 19 miles north of Cle Elum on Salmon la Sac road, is a developed stock (horse, llama, goat etc) campground, occupants must be accompanied by stock to use this campground. Corrals, hitch rails, potable water, fire rings, picnic tables, and vault toilets. Forage is not available. Certified weed free feed is required. Six campsites are first come first serve, the remaining eight are available by reservation at recreation.gov or by calling 877-444-6777. Fee

CAPACITY: 3 horses per campsite

NUMBER OF CAMPSITES: 14

Ken Wilcox Horse Camp at Haney Meadows – Located 8 miles off highway 97 on FS road 9712 is designed for stock users but is open to all forest visitors. Limit 3 horses per site. Loading ramps, hitch rails, highline posts, picnic tables, fire rings, vault toilets and a large gathering area are available. No potable water is available. Stock water is available, forage is not. Certified weed free feed is required. Fee = Northwest Forest Pass or equivalent. CAPACITY: 3 horses per campsite

NUMBER OF CAMPSITES: 17

Following are other horse facilities available on the Cle Elum Ranger District. **Please note that there are no overnight horse holding facilities at these campgrounds:**

Riders Camp – located on FS road 31, 23 miles west of Ellensburg is not a traditional campground. Sites are not designated, however vault toilets and some picnic tables and fire rings are provided. There is not potable water; stock water is available in nearby Manastash Creek. Trails open to all users originate in this campground. Fee = Northwest Forest Pass.

Manastash Camp – located on FS road 3120, 24 miles west of Ellensburg and 1 mile from Riders camp. Picnic tables, fire rings, vault toilets. Availability of potable water is sporadic; it is advised that you bring water. Stock water is available at nearby Manastash Creek. Trails open to all users originate in this campground. Fee = Northwest Forest Pass

ENTIAT RANGER DISTRICT

There are no public corrals on the Entiat Ranger District. There is a corral at Cottonwood Guard Station which may eventually be available for rent with Cabin but is not available at this time.

The **North Fork Entiat Trailhead and Entiat River Trailhead** have loading ramps and hitch rails. North Tommy Trailhead and Middle Tommy Trailhead have room for trailers but no other horse facilities.

WENATCHEE RIVER RANGER DISTRICT

Chiwawa Horse Camp (18 miles north of Lake Wenatchee on Chiwawa Valley Road #6200) has loading ramps, facilities to tie high lines, wheelchair accessible vault toilets, picnic tables, fire rings, horse trough, and a solar powered water pump (tested drinking water). The facility also features two short bridle trails appropriate for young or physically challenged riders. There are two campsites that are designed to accommodate wheelchair users and an accessible wheelchair ramp for disabled riders.

These wheelchair accessible sites can be reserved by calling the Leavenworth Ranger Station a week or more in advance. When not reserved, the sites (#20 and #21) are available to other users

CAPACITY: 6 horses per campsite

NUMBER OF CAMPSITES: 21. Fee required

Phelps Creek Horse Camp (25 miles north of Lake Wenatchee on Chiwawa Valley Road #6200) has facilities to tie high lines, wheelchair accessible vault toilets, picnic tables, and fire rings. No potable water. Loading ramp and stock water are available at Buck Creek Trailhead adjacent to the campground.

CAPACITY: 6 horses per campsite

NUMBER OF CAMPSITES: 6. Fee required

Blackpine Campground (at the end of Icicle Road #7600) has facilities to tie high lines, vault toilets, picnic tables, fire rings, and tested drinking water. Loading ramp available at the Blackpine stock unloading area.

CAPACITY: 6 horses per campsite

NUMBER OF CAMPSITES: 10. Fee required.

The following trailheads have loading ramps and hitch rails. No water is available. All listed trailheads except Devils Gulch and Red Hill enter wilderness where the group size limit is 12 combined people and stock. A Recreation Pass is required for use of these trailheads.

Rock Creek #1509 (at the Chiwawa Horse Camp on Chiwawa River Road #6200)

Buck Creek #1513 (end of the Chiwawa River Road #6200 at Trinity)

White River #1507 (end of the White River Road #6400)

Little Wenatchee Ford #1525 (end of the Little Wenatchee River Road #6500)

Hatchery Creek #1577 (10 miles west of Leavenworth off Highway 2 on Hatchery Creek Road #7905)

Chiwaukum #1571 (11 miles west of Leavenworth off Highway 2 on Chiwaukum Creek Road #7908)

Jack-Trout #1558 (near Rock Island Campground on the Icicle Road #7600)

Blackpine stock unloading area provides access to Icicle Creek #1551 and Blackjack Ridge #1565 trails (near the end of the Icicle Road #7600)

Ingalls Creek #1215 (turn off Highway 97 at the Ingalls Creek Trading Post)

Devils Gulch #1220 (on Mission Creek Road #7100 about 3 miles from the end of the county road)

Red Hill #1223 (on Sand Creek Road #7104)

METHOW VALLEY RANGER DISTRICT

Highway 20 Area

(a Northwest Forest Pass is required at all of these trailheads):

Canyon Creek Trailhead (on Highway 20) has an outhouse and parking for 30 vehicles. The trail accesses Jackita Ridge or Canyon Creek. Be aware, the trail is closed between Boulder Creek and Mill Creek on Trail #754, and Trail #738 is not maintained to the National Park boundary. No camping is allowed at the trailhead.

East Creek Trailhead (on Highway 20) has an outhouse and parking for 15 vehicles. The trail is only maintained for 1¾ miles. No camping is allowed at the trailhead.

Easy Pass Trailhead (on Highway 20) has an outhouse and parking for 11 vehicles. The trail follows Easy Pass Creek into North Cascades National Park. No camping allowed at trailhead.

Bridge Creek Trailhead (on Highway 20) has a loading ramp, hitch rails, an outhouse, and parking for 26 vehicles. Pacific Crest Trail is accessed from this trailhead. No camping is allowed at the trailhead.

PCT North Trailhead (on Highway 20 across from Rainy Pass) has a loading ramp, hitch rails, an outhouse, and parking for 17 vehicles. The Pacific Crest Trail is accessible from here. No camping is allowed at the trailhead.

Cutthroat Trailhead (on Highway 20) has an outhouse and parking for 21 vehicles. The trail takes you into Cutthroat Lake and then up to Cutthroat pass on the Pacific Crest Trail. No camping is allowed at the trailhead.

Driveway Butte Trailhead (on Road #300 off Highway 20) has a loading ramp, hitch rails, an outhouse, and parking for five vehicles. The trail ends at Driveway Butte. No camping is allowed at the trailhead.

Cedar Creek Trailhead (on highway 20) has a loading ramp, hitch rails, an outhouse, and parking for 17 vehicles. The trail follows Cedar Creek and connects with the North Lake Trail in the Twisp River area. Be aware, the trail can be difficult to follow near the end. No camping is allowed at the trailhead.

Monument Creek Trailhead (on Road #5400 off Road #9140 out of Mazama) has parking for seven vehicles. The trail takes you into the Pasayten Wilderness and is not recommended for stock beyond 4 miles. No camping is allowed at the trailhead.

Robinson Creek Trailhead (on Road #5400 off Road #9140 out of Mazama) has a loading ramp, hitch rails, an outhouse, and parking for 17 vehicles. Trail accesses Pasayten Wilderness. Trailers are not allowed up the road to Hart's Pass, so this is the best trailhead to access that area if you have a trailer. No camping is allowed at the trailhead.

Rattlesnake Trailhead (on Road #5400 off Road #9140 out of Mazama) has parking for 4-6 vehicles. The trail follows the West Fork of the Methow River to the junction with the Pacific Crest Trail. No camping is allowed at the trailhead.

Hart's Pass Trailhead (on Road #5400 off Road #9140 out of Mazama) has a loading ramp, hitch rails, outhouse, and parking for 10 vehicles. Trail accesses Pasayten Wilderness trails, including Pacific Crest Trail. No camping allowed at trailhead.

Winthrop Area (Northwest Forest Pass required at all):

Billygoat Trailhead (on Road #5130) has a loading ramp, hitch rails, an outhouse, and parking for 17 vehicles. Trail accesses Pasayten Wilderness. No camping is allowed at the trailhead; however, dispersed sites are located nearby.

Copper Glance Trailhead (on Road #5130) has parking for 2-4 vehicles. The trail follows an old road to begin with, which turns into a trail that takes you to Copper Glance Lake. No camping is allowed at the trailhead.

Crystal Lake Trailhead (on Road #080 off Road #51) has a loading ramp, hitch rails, an outhouse, and parking for 4-6 vehicles. The trail takes you to Crystal Lake in the Pasayten Wilderness. No camping is allowed at the trailhead.

Lake Creek Trailhead (on Road #100 off Road #51) has a loading ramp, hitch rails, an outhouse, a corral, and parking for four vehicles. The trail takes you into Blake Lake in the Pasayten Wilderness. No camping is allowed at the trailhead; however, dispersed sites are located nearby.

Andrew's Creek Trailhead (on Road #5160) has a loading ramp, hitch rails, an outhouse, and parking for four vehicles. There is also a corral located across the road from the outhouse and parking area. The trail takes you into the Pasayten Wilderness. No camping is allowed at the trailhead; however, dispersed sites are located nearby.

Thirtymile Trailhead (on Road #250 off Road #5160) has a loading ramp, hitch rails, an outhouse, and parking for 14 vehicles. The trail takes you into the Pasayten Wilderness. No camping is allowed at the trailhead.

Tiffany Lake Trailhead (on Road #37) has an outhouse and parking for four vehicles. The trail takes you past Tiffany Lake where you can access other trails, such as the Freezeout Ridge Trail. No camping is allowed at the trailhead.

North Fork 20-Mile Trailhead (on Road #700 off Road #5010) has parking for four vehicles. The trail takes you to North Twentymile Lookout. No camping is allowed at the trailhead.

Wolf Creek Trailhead (on Road #5005) has an outhouse and parking for 17 vehicles. The trail follows Wolf Creek to Abernathy Ridge. No camping is allowed at the trailhead.

Twisp River Area (Northwest Forest Pass required at all):

Gilbert Trailhead (on Road #4440) has an outhouse, a loading ramp, hitch rails, stock water in the creek, and parking for nine vehicles. Twisp Pass and North Lake Trail start at the Gilbert Trailhead. These trails will also take you into the Sawtooth Wilderness. No camping is allowed at the trailhead.

Twisp River Horse Camp (at the end of Road #4435) is the only developed horse camp in the Methow Valley Ranger District. This site offers camping areas, hitch rails, restroom, feed stations, fire rings, and limited parking for trailers and stock trucks (maximum length is 30 feet). Twisp River trails are accessible from the horse camp and access Sawtooth Wilderness. CAPACITY: 4-6 horses per campsite
NUMBER OF CAMPSITES: 12

Scatter Creek Trailhead (on Road #4440) has a loading ramp, hitch rails, an outhouse, and parking for 8 vehicles. Scatter Lake is accessed from this trailhead and the trail will take you into the Sawtooth Wilderness. No camping is allowed at the trailhead.

War Creek Trailhead (on Road #100 off the #4430 Road) has a loading ramp, hitch rails, outhouse, and parking for eight vehicles. The trail accesses the Sawtooth Wilderness and Lake Chelan National Recreation area. No camping allowed at trailhead.

Eagle Creek Trailhead (on Road #080 off Road #4420) has a loading ramp, hitch rails, an outhouse, and parking for 13 vehicles. The Oval Lakes are accessible from this trailhead. No camping is allowed at the trailhead.

METHOW VALLEY RANGER DISTRICT continued...

West Fork of Buttermilk Trailhead (on Road #400 off Road #43) has an outhouse and parking for six vehicles. Trail accesses the Sawtooth Wilderness. No camping is allowed at trailhead.

Twisp River Trailhead (on Road #4420) has an outhouse and parking for 21 vehicles. The trail follows along the Twisp River to the end of the road. No camping is allowed at the trailhead.

Crater Creek Trailhead (on Road #300 off Road #4340) has a loading ramp, hitch rails, an outhouse, and parking for eight vehicles. The trail takes you into Crater Lake, Eagles Lakes, and Boiling Lake. No camping is allowed at the trailhead.

Foggy Dew Trailhead (on Road #200 off Road #4340) has a loading ramp, hitch rails, an outhouse, and parking for 21 vehicles. The trail takes you to Foggy Dew Falls and Sunrise Lake. No camping is allowed at the trailhead.

Williams Lake Trailhead (on Road #4430) has a loading ramp, hitch rails, an outhouse, and parking for four vehicles. The trail takes you into Williams Lake in the Sawtooth Wilderness. No camping is allowed at the trailhead.

South Creek Trailhead (on Road #4440) has parking for three vehicles. South Creek Trail branches off to Louis Lake in the Sawtooth Wilderness, or into the Lake Chelan National Recreation area. No camping is allowed at trailhead.

Reynolds Creek Trailhead (on Road #4435) has parking for five vehicles. The trail follows Reynolds Creek to Reynolds Peak in Sawtooth Wilderness. No camping is allowed at the trailhead.

Slate Creek Trailhead (on Road #44) has parking for five vehicles. The trail takes you into Slate Lake in the Sawtooth Wilderness. No camping is allowed at trailhead.

East Fork Buttermilk Trailhead (on Road #400 off Road #43) has parking for six vehicles. The trail follows the East Fork Buttermilk Creek over Hoodoo Pass in the Sawtooth Wilderness. No camping is allowed at trailhead.

Libby Lake Trailhead (on Road #750 off Road #43) has parking for four vehicles. The trail takes you to Libby Lake in the Sawtooth Wilderness. No camping is allowed at trailhead.

Lookout Mountain Trailhead (located on Road #1065) has parking for four vehicles. The trail takes you to the lookout, and continues over Lookout Ridge. However, past the lookout the trail is difficult to follow. No camping is allowed at trailhead.

Lightning Creek Trailhead (on Road #1637) has parking for 4-6 vehicles. The trail follows Lightning Creek and ends at junction with Road #4235. No camping is allowed at trailhead.

Beaver Lake Trailhead (on Road #100 off Road #4235) has parking for 6-8 vehicles. The trail takes you into Beaver Lake. No camping is allowed at the trailhead.

NACHES RANGER DISTRICT

Chinook Pass Area

(a recreation pass is required at all of these trailheads):

Rattlesnake Trailhead (on Road #1500) has three dispersed campgrounds with fire rings, two hitch rails, a horse ramp, and parking for six passenger vehicles and three vehicles with trailers. Stock water is within ¼ mile. Elevation 3,100 feet.

NACHES RANGER DISTRICT continued...

Crow Lake Way Trailhead (two miles east of Pleasant Valley Campground off Highway 410) has seven hitch rails, two toilets, stock water available from Miners Creek (usually through August), and has no purified drinking water. There are six small dispersed areas that can be used for camping. Parking available for 12 vehicles. Elevation 3,300 feet.

Chinook Pass Trailhead (½ mile east of Chinook Pass off Highway 410) has two toilets, loading ramp, hitch rail. Trailhead accesses Pacific Crest Trail north and south and is heavily used by hikers. No camping at trailhead. Parking available but limited (three parking spurs). No water available. Elevation 5,400 feet.

Deep Creek Horse Camp (accessed from #1808-395 road) has six small dispersed campsites (no toilets or drinking water are available), and six hitch rails. Parking is available for 15 vehicles. Stock can be watered at Deep Creek. Elevation 4,338 feet.

CAPACITY: 3-4 horses per camping unit

Mesatchee Creek, off of Highway 410, has three dispersed campsites, two toilets, two hitch rails, horse ramp, parking for six vehicles. Stock water located ½ mile away at Morse Creek. Elevation 3,620 feet.

CAPACITY: 3-4 horses per camping unit

NUMBER OF CAMPSITES: 3. No drinking water or garbage pickup.

Swamp Lake Trailhead (on #1800 Road) has two toilets, hitch rail, loading ramp, parking for five vehicles (limited turn-around space). No camping facilities are available. Stock water available at Bumping River. Trailer parking and turnaround space is limited at times. Elevation 3,600 feet. Dispersed camping areas located at top of hill by Fish Lake Way Trail.

White Pass Area

(a recreation pass is required at all of these trailheads):

Indian Creek Trailhead (accessed by way of Road #1308) has one toilet, a loading ramp, and a hitch rail. There are four small areas that can be used for camping. No water or garbage facilities are available. Parking is available for six vehicles. Spring water can be located south of the trailhead. Elevation 3,100 feet.

Scatter Creek Trailhead (off #1207 road) has one toilet, loading ramp, and two hitch rails. No camping facilities are available. There are four dispersed campsites. Parking for five vehicles. Elevation 3,400 feet. Stock water available at Scatter Creek.

Sand Ridge Trailhead (on Highway 12) has two dispersed campsites, one toilet, a horse ramp, a hitch rail, and parking for eight vehicles. No water is available. Elevation 3,500 feet. CAPACITY: 3-4 horses per camping unit.

White Pass Horse Camp (on Highway 12) has six dispersed campsites, two toilets, horse ramp, eight hitch rails, parking for 18 vehicles. Spring water is available. This horse camp accesses the Pacific Crest Trail (PCT) north trailhead. Elevation 4,550 feet. CAPACITY: 3-4 horses per camping unit

White Pass Trailhead (PCT south off of Highway 12) has a horse ramp, four hitch rails, parking for four vehicles. Stock water is available at campground entrance. Elevation 4,412 feet.

MJB Area (accessed by Road #1500) has one or two dispersed campsites (no toilet or water facilities are available), two hitch rails (for nine horses), parking for five vehicles, no stock water.
