

Brooks Memorial State Park

Brooks Memorial State Park is a 700-acre, year-round camping park located between the barren hills of the south Yakima Valley and the lodgepole pine forests of the Simcoe Mountains. The park provides a variety of natural environments for visitors to enjoy. Over 9 miles of hiking trails lead along the Little Klickitat River and up through the Ponderosa and Oregon Pine forests. At the top are open mountain meadows with a panoramic view of Mount Hood. Visitors may see deer, beaver dams, squirrels, spring wildflowers, and a variety of birds.

US Route 97 to milepost 24.66 (entrance both right and left) Main entrance on the west side of the highway however most of the park property is on the east side of the highway! 11.4 miles north of Goldendale and the US Route 97 intersection with State Route 142. 36.6 miles south of Toppenish and the intersection of US Route 97 and State Route 22.
